

**Job Title** African wildlife forensics: project coordinator

**Role** A two-year full-time post is available for a project coordinator to help enhance wildlife forensic capacity in Gabon, Kenya and Tanzania. The successful applicant will be responsible for managing activities under two related TRACE projects: the first aims to support the forensic DNA analysis of large seizures across the three countries; the second will focus on coordinating the implementation of multiple forensic disciplines for wildlife law enforcement in Gabon.

The successful applicant will have experience of forensic science and project management, and ideally experience of working in partnership with government agencies to deliver technical capacity. The post will involve hands-on laboratory analysis support, knowledge of quality assurance systems and extensive independent travel, principally in Africa. Fluency in English and French language is required.
