

Job Title Wildlife DNA Forensics – Technical Advisor, SE Asia. 25k GBP p/a

- Role A rare opportunity to work at the frontline of the illegal wildlife trade providing wildlife DNA forensic support in SE Asia. The position of Technical Advisor is a dual research and application role to be based alongside other TRACE technical staff hosted at the National Wildlife Forensics Laboratory in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.
 - Provide field assistance for DNA sampling from large wildlife seizures
 - Develop additional DNA assays for testing wildlife seizures.
 - Undertake laboratory work to support wildlife DNA forensic testing in Malaysia
 - Provide training to Customs and Enforcement officers with regard to wildlife forensics.

Requirements

- An MSc in a suitable DNA related subject such as conservation genetics / forensics / molecular biology.
- Laboratory proficiency with DNA extraction, PCR, Sanger sequencing, microsatellites etc.
- An interest and knowledge in the illegal wildlife trade.
- An ability to work independently or as part of a small team in stressful environments.
